### **Two BU Delts Share a Unique Bond**

### Diagnosed with ALS, Eric Von Shaumburg '05 and Marty D'Amore '88 Find Comfort in Their DTD Connections

At the young age of 30, **Eric Von Schaumburg '05** is in the fight of his life. Earlier this year, Eric was diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's Disease, a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord. His speech has been impaired. Chewing food is a challenge. While there is no cure or treatment that halts or reverses ALS, Eric's spirit remains bright, thanks in part to the overwhelming support he's received from his Delt brothers.

"Not knowing where to turn [after my diagnosis], we immediately sent out emails to hundreds of people looking for any connections to prominent ALS physicians, researchers and treatment facilities," says Eric.

"Not surprisingly, my Delt brothers stepped up in unbelievable fashion. The outpouring of leads, connections, donations and support was inspiring and definitely

One of those connections was to **Marty D'Amore '88**, a fellow BU Delt who is also battling ALS. Marty was diagnosed in April 2010 after suffering from the progressive manifestations of the disease for three years. Like Eric, he too has found comfort in the support of his Delt brothers.

"Soon after my diagnosis, **Tim Lyne** '87 hosted a small Delt reunion with **Brent Coan '87, Mark Willford '88, Gene Smith** '88 and **BJ Jenkins '87**," Marty fondly remembers. "Brent dusted off his old Delt photos, which ignited several stories rich with laughter as we were taken back in time. It was good to hear everybody's laugh again. The gathering was good for my soul."

Marty has applied the spirit of support to help raise money and awareness for ALS. He has participated in quite a few fundraisers, including Chicago and Charlotte marathons, parties, hikes and walks, raising \$175,000 for ALS research. He has also written about his journey with ALS and how it has enriched his life (the manuscript is currently with an editor).

Eric had the opportunity to read Marty's autobiography. With the brothers' shared commonality, the two have formed a unique bond in their battles against this disease.

"[Marty's story] is truly inspirational," says Eric. "He has turned a devastating illness into hope, compassion and charitable embodiments for those who surround him. He told me that the past few years of his life have been some of his most gratifying. It takes a strong character to live life that way."

Eric has found the support from Marty and other BU Delts remarkable. In fact, **Grant Hamilton '90**, a doctor at Mayo Clinic in an unrelated field, was able to help Eric secure an appointment with one of the clinic's top ALS specialists after being told he would need to wait months to do so.

"The ALS specialist we saw was amazing, and if it wasn't for Grant, we would have never gotten the opportunity to meet him," said Eric. "My family and I were so grateful to Grant for all the help he provided us."

While both Eric and Marty have benefitted from the overwhelming support

they've received from their Delt brothers, their strong spirits have sparked a selfless attitude that we all can – and should - live by.

"This diagnosis has allowed me to take a step back and determine what is really important in life," says Eric. "Family, relationships, friends and love are four aspects of my life that have strengthened tremendously since my diagnosis. I would tell people to not sweat the small stuff (much easier said than done). Life is a beautiful thing, go out and enjoy it."

Each September, a 2+ mile walk fundraiser is held in Chicago in demonstration of hope, community and caring to honor the lives and legacies of those who have been affected by ALS. Fellow Illinois fraternity ATO participates in this walk annually, contributing \$11,215 this year alone in honor of one of their alumni battling ALS. **Bob Faust '89**, owner of a Chicago-based cultural branding and communications studio, was recently profiled by imprintculturelab. com about his recent projects. Bob's studio helps develop identity, print, and digital design for clients, including Denver Art Museum and *Playboy*. Bob has also worked on a performance project series in Grand Central Terminal called HEARD•NY, with Chicagobased artist Nick Cave and choreographer Will Gill.

#### How did you launch Faust?

After testing the waters in a large design studio and small boutique studio, freelance and a stint as manager of design and production services at *Playboy*, I was able to choose the type of studio I ultimately wanted to lead. I learned it needed to be small with no walls and one steeped in the arts and didn't allow the words "you can't do that" within earshot.

#### How would you describe your job?

I'm part artist, part designer, part mediator and therapist. But the trait I am most thankful for is that of listener. It is the one thing I can count on to always be my guide.

### What's the best thing about living and working in Chicago?

I'm asked this a lot, so have thought about

it a lot. While the coasts offer so much with regard to attitude, edge and acknowledgment, Chicago is the capital of America and offers everything you need to be anything you want, so it is the perfect place to freely work toward something great.
