BJ Jenkins: Ringing the Bell on the NYSE

Successful Delt, Illini Grad and CEO

William (BJ) Jenkins was initiated into the Beta Upsilon Chapter of Delta Tau Delta in 1985 and graduated from the University of Illinois in 1987. On campus, he was Homecoming King in 1986 and played as a walk-on to the Illini varsity basketball team as a freshman. He served the chapter as Rush Chairman and Vice President, active and engaged from the moment he stepped foot on campus.

a thrilling day, ringing the bell, seeing the first trade, fielding interviews with CNN, CNBC and TheStreet.

In the 10 years since the company was founded, they have reached 150,000 customers and been a consistent grower. The market recognized quality when it saw it, raising about \$75 million on the first day of trade. The company always had a strong balance sheet, and has been

cash flow positive.

BJ shared the pride in his company, "From the beginning, for us going public really started with customer and partner legitimacy. From a corporate perspective, we see ourselves as a unique business model aimed at mid-market customers. We really think we're the only ones focused there. Over the past 12 months we've introduced five new products to the market, and we'll be very focused in the next 12 months on promoting those, getting them in customers' hands. Everything we do around our business model is based around having that customer find us, and then for it to be a very quick time to starting a relationship. It's letting our existing customers know that we've expanded the solutions that we provide, and that when they have issues in one of those new areas, Barracuda is a company that can solve their problem."

BJ currently lives in Lives in Los Gatos, California with his wife, Julie, and their two children, a daughter, Tatum, who is 13, and a son, Trey, 11. On the lasting bonds of the fraternity BJ has said, "Being part of Delta Tau Delta has created a bond that has certainly professionally served me well, and more importantly, the people I befriended there are the people I share my life with."

We send him our congratulations and best wishes for continued success!

Not much has changed in the years since his undergrad. BJ is keenly aware of the important part Delta Tau Delta role models and mentors played in shaping his career. "Just as importantly, my lifelong friends came from the fraternity and those are the ones that I still talk to today for advice and perspective on decisions, and key things that are going on in our lives," BJ said.

BJ joined EMC Corporation in 1998 and held a wide range of senior leadership roles before becoming President of the BRS Division, including serving as Chief of Staff for the division. Over the years, he also held the positions of Senior Vice President of Global Marketing; Vice President of Telecom, Media and Entertainment and Outsourcing Sales; Vice President of Global Field Marketing and Director of Operations Global Channels.

In November of 2012, Barracuda Networks Inc., a leading provider of security and data protection solutions, announced that it had appointed BJ as President, Chief Executive Officer, and Member of the Board of Directors. He was recognized as being a "dynamic and engaging leader." Jenkins was tasked with leading the company's strategy and growth as it moved towards IPO.

One year later, he achieved that goal as he rang the opening bell at the NYSE and offered Barracuda stock for trade for the first time. It was

The Time Is Now: Please Make Your Contribution to the Chapter House




donors, our average raised per donation has decreased.


