

## ALUMNI PROFILE

### John Gleeson '68 Continues to Stay Involved with the Fraternity that has Given Him Best Friends and Taught Him so Much about Life

#### *John Recommends Alumni Involvement for All with Loyalty to Delta Tau Delta*

##### **Why did you join Delta Tau Delta?**

Several of my friends from home had pledged Delts and I was struck by the camaraderie of the large (55 men) pledge class of 1968. In the 1960s, fraternity houses were maintained in a very civilized manor with the influence of a full time housemother. The place was spectacular and had that traditional feeling that spoke of deep roots and high ideals. Even as a fan on the sidelines, I liked the sports atmosphere with tournaments and meaningful competition with other fraternities. I must say that the food was much better than the dorm. Even in the beginning, it was obvious that I was joining friends for life who I chose as opposed to the random assignment of roommates and associates in the dormitory. It turns out I was quite right.

##### **What was your favorite memory of the fraternity?**

It seems like I remember every single thing that happened in those years at Illinois, so it is impossible to pick a favorite moment. When our house burned down in 1967, I was Chapter president. We had more than fifty men ready to move into that house in ten days. To this day I am struck by the sacrifices our members made to hold the Chapter together, especially the new pledges who hung with us even though living conditions were very rough. The guys that went through that time are my Delt heroes to this day.

##### **With whom do you stay in contact?**

**Jim Thompson** put the pledge pin on me in 1964. He has remained my friend all these years. We watched the Bears game together last weekend. **Lucky Somers '68** was my roommate for three years. He and I are in regular contact and see one another several times a year, even though he lives in California in the same neighborhood with **Dennis Mesic '68** who keeps me laughing whenever I talk to him.

**Don Rowley '68** is a pledge Brother and was treasurer while I was president. Don kept me in line in school and still does. He just retired as varsity basketball coach at John Hersey High School in Arlington Heights. **John "Elmer" Conrad '68** usually gives me a call when he is anywhere near Chicago and we have always stayed close. **Dennis Heydnek '67** has always been loyal to our projects at BU. He is a regular



correspondent and attended the recent BU 135th anniversary celebration and reunion in Champaign. I hear from **Jerry Gea '69**, **Mark Brennan '71**, **Ron Cowell '71**, **Roland Wolff '69**, **Jim Jorgenson '70**, **Ken Jorgenson '73**, **Pat Meehan '67**, **Tom Hickey '65**, **Dennis Tierney '68**, and **Jim Whiteside**. Recently, I renewed contact with **Chris Holiday '69**, **Howard Holiday '72**, **Al Nudo '70**, **Scott Menie**, **Jack Kamerer**, and **Gerry O'Neill**. I have lots of younger friends from Delt classes I have worked with through the years, including **Greg Kazarian '84**, former president of the Northern Division of the fraternity who pledged at a rush party at my house in 1981. Greg has served as Chapter advisor and house corporation president and is well known and respected throughout the fraternity. I have been fortunate to know **Matt Wilson '89** who is a dedicated and skilled alumni advisor to the Chapter.

##### **Did you live at the house? If so, who were your roommates? Tell us a memorable time with them.**

I lived in room ten overlooking the parking lot. My roommate was Lucky Somers but, because we were next to the cold dorm, everybody stopped in Room 10 before bed to "RF" about events of the day.

##### **What leadership positions did you hold at the Chapter?**

Social chair and president

##### **What other activities or organizations were you involved with during your college days?**

Officer, Interfraternity Council

##### **What influence has the fraternity experience had on your life?**

The fraternity has provided me with my best friends, the opportunity to test my own leadership abilities at various stages in my life, the mentoring of alumni like **Bob Ferris**, the chance to work with bright young men like Greg Kazarian and Matt Wilson, and a continuing

relationship with a new group of friends at the national fraternity level as a member of the Delta Tau Delta Educational Foundation.

##### **What do you do for a living?**

Senior Vice President, Chief Strategy Officer, Walgreen Co.

##### **Tell us about your family.**

Married to Deborah, 23 years. Son, Max (21) and daughter, Elizabeth (18) are both in college.

##### **What hobbies do you enjoy?**

I play some golf and enjoy playing bass guitar with "The Executones," a rock band of Walgreen colleagues. We have played at six undergraduate homecoming parties at the Delt Shelter.

##### **Tell us about your involvement in Delta Tau Delta over the years.**

I served with outstanding alumni on the alumni committee to re-build the Chapter after the restructuring in 1981. With Bob Ferris and Ken File, President of the Delta Tau Delta Educational Foundation, I led the "Journey Back to John Street" to finance the acquisition and remodeling of 401 E. John Street. I have been privileged to be invited to work with the active Chapter from time to time on strategic planning meetings. These encounters have always left me with the confidence that our undergraduates have been consistently constructive in building a better Delta Tau Delta at the University of Illinois.

##### **What would you say to your Brothers about remaining involved with the fraternity?**

I have never invested a dollar or an hour on behalf of this fraternity that has not been returned to me ten times over. Fraternity is all about a relationship of men across the generations. I would recommend the experience of alumni involvement to anyone with a constructive nature and a loyalty to the house.

CHAMPAIGN – William Charles (Bill) Dallenbach III, 79, died Tuesday, July 3, 2007, in Chicago after an extended illness.


Mr. Dallenbach was born to William Charles and Kathryn Baynes
